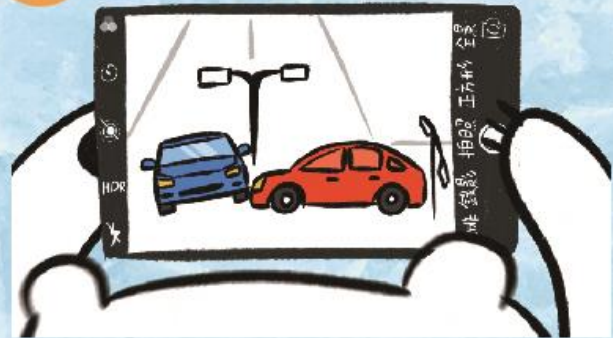
# A3 traffic accident site

## Five guidelines for photo taking

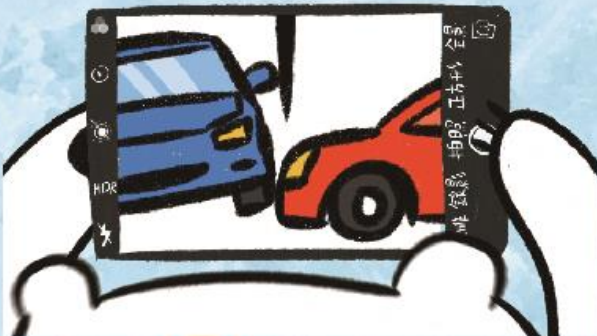
**1** Place the red warning triangle



**2** Take panoramic photos (including road markings)



**3** Take photos of the point of impact and damaged parts



**4** Move the vehicles to a safe place as soon as possible (such as roadside)



**5** **Pay attention** to safety while video recording and moving your vehicle

# Before the police arrives, you have two options:

The parties involved **should take photos and move the vehicles to the side**

Then dial 110



Common points

Dial 110 first

Interested parties **will be instructed to take photos and move the vehicles to the side as soon as possible**

**Take photos yourself and move the vehicles to the side as soon as possible**



**Safety First – Remember to place the warning triangle at a proper distance behind the accident site**

Why should I move the vehicle to a safe place **as soon as possible**?

**A:**

(1) Avoid a **second traffic accident** for yourself and others, causing further casualties

(2) Causes traffic jams, slows down the police arrival speed, **and increases waiting time**





**Q:**

**Are the photos taken by the parties involved regarded as evidence?**

**A:**

**Of course!**



(1) The photos provided by the parties involved as important references taken by the police in the Traffic Accident Preliminary Analysis and Assessment Form

(2) When the parties involved have doubts regarding the cause of traffic accident and apply for investigation, the police will forward the photos provided by the parties involved to the Traffic Accident Investigation Committee as **major evidence**.
