When a large vehicle turns, there will be a difference in radius between inner wheels. You may be hit by it easily.



Safety Guidelines



Large vehicle drivers: When turning, **slow down**. Turn your head to confirm.



Other drivers and pedestrians: In the red area, it is the **dangerous zone caused by the difference in radius between inner wheels**. Never get into that zone and keep a safe distance from large vehicles.





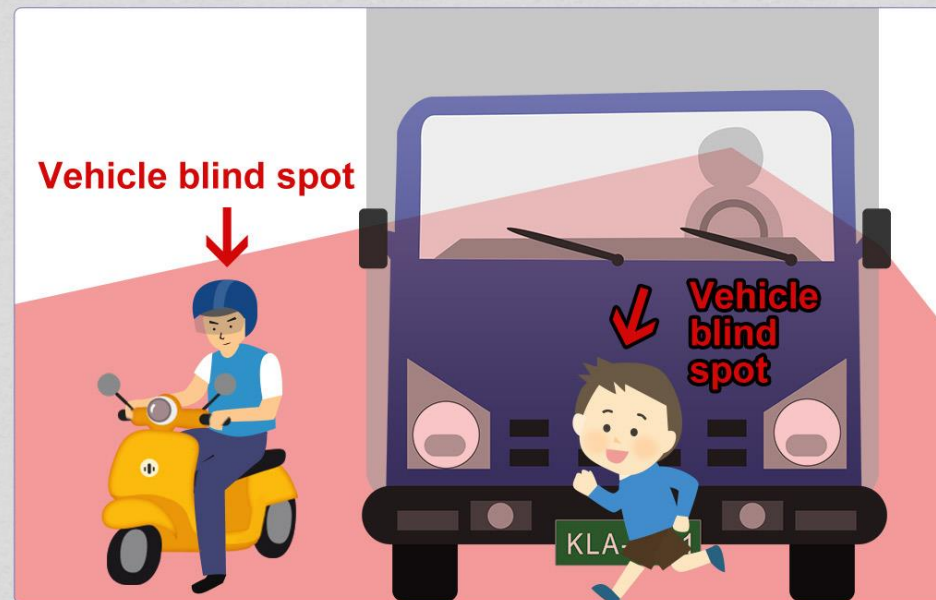
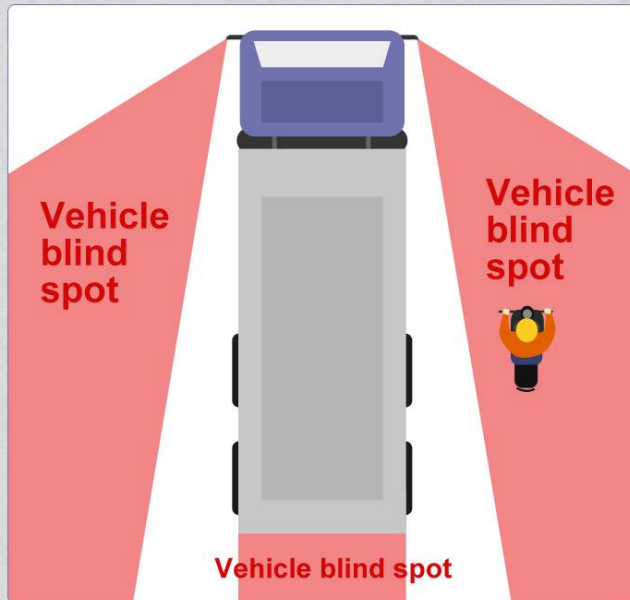
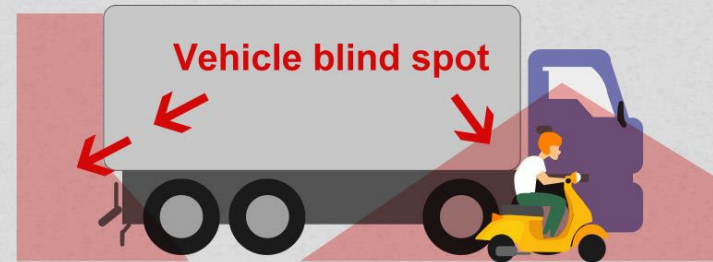
The blind spots of large vehicle drivers' vision

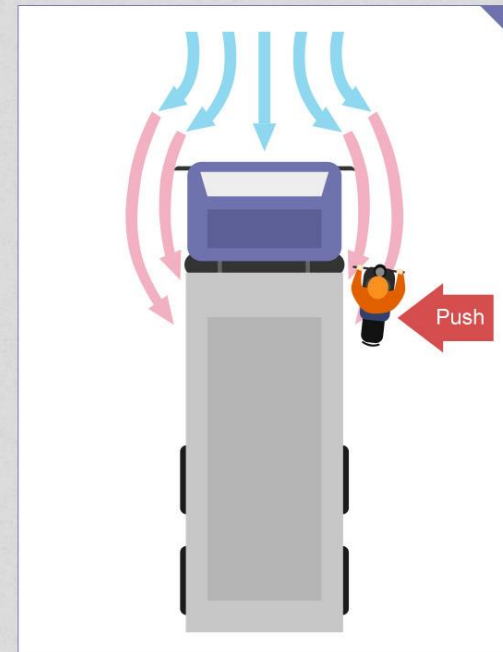
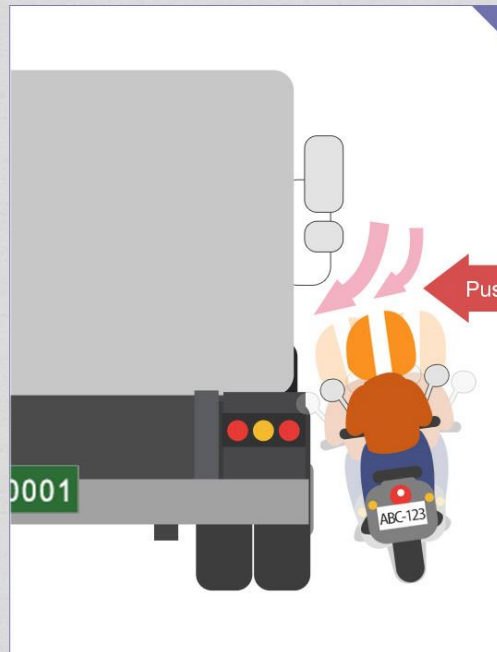
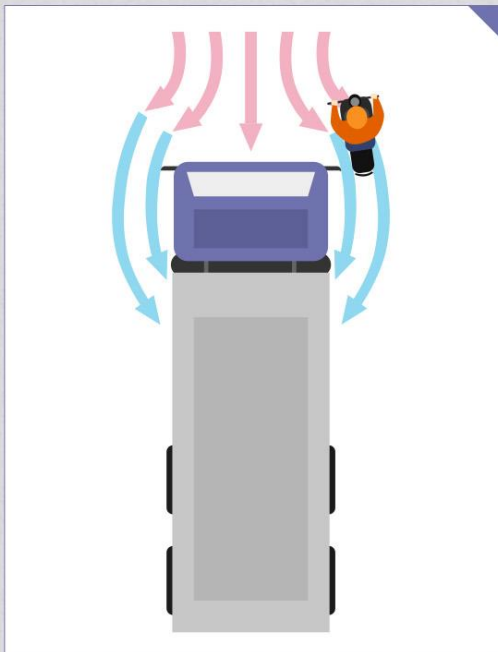


There are many vehicle blind spots for large vehicles. Don't think that they can see you! Pedestrians never cross the road in front of large vehicles. Motorcycles and bicycles never ride parallel to large vehicles or always turn the headlights on. Try your best to keep away from large vehicle.





There is airflow when driving. It sucks you in.



Safety Guidelines



There is strong airflow caused by running large vehicles. It sucks people and vehicles in. Motorcycles and bicycles should keep a safe distance from large vehicles

Large vehicles



Long braking distance for vehicles. Remember to keep a safety distance.

With the speed of **90** km/hour as example: The safe distance for a large vehicle should be **70**m, and **45**m for light vehicles



Maintain a safe distance when driving



↳ Large vehicles should keep a **70**m safety distance

(The speed minus 20m or for distance for 3 seconds)



Maintain a safe distance when driving



↳ Small vehicles should keep a safety distance of **45**m

(The speed divided by 2 or the distance of 2 seconds)



Safety Guidelines



Drivers of large and other vehicles:

For the braking distance, please follow the illustrations above to maintain a safety distance. When approaching intersections, slow down and prepare to brake in advance.
